LAST WEEK SERIES RECAP

The Chicago Bandits and the Aussie Peppers commenced a 5-game series at Caswell Park on Monday, July 8. The Bandits took the opener 6-0 as Rachele Fico, Kelly Barnhill, and Paige Lowary combined to hold the Peppers to 1 Hit. Offensively, Hannah Flippen went 2-3 with 2 Home Runs and 4 RBI, and Amanda Chidester contributed a Home Run as well. The Peppers responded the next day with a 5-1 win behind Kaia Parnaby's Complete Game of work in the circle, throwing 133 Pitches and 9 Strikeouts. It was a balanced offensive effort for the home team, as only Jade Wall had more than 1 of the team's 8 Hits, going 2-2 with a RBI and a Hit by Pitch, and Rachel Lack recorded the team's only Extra Base Hit, going 1-2 with a Double and also a Walk. The next day, the Peppers made it two in a row by recording a 5-3 victory to begin a Wednesday doubleheader. The Peppers trailed 3-1 in the bottom of the sixth inning before a 4-Run rally; Jade Wall hit a 2-Run Home Run and Madeline Cameron knocked in 2 Runs on a Double. Verity Long and Leah Parry had 2-Hit games for the Peppers while Danielle O'Toole, who started the game and got a No-Decision, threw 6 Strikeouts in 5 Innings Pitched. In the second game of the day, the Bandits left no doubt as to the result by putting up 17 Runs and allowing 0. For the Bandits, 5 players had 2 Hits, every starting hitter plus 3 reserves had at least 1 Hit, and Hannah Flippen hit a Home Run. Defensively, Kelly Barnhill threw 4 innings of No-Hit ball although she also allowed 5 Walks. The Bandits closed the series with a 7-1 victory on Thursday, July 11. Abbey Cheek paced their hitters with an incredible 3 Solo Home Runs while Amanda Chidester joined with 2 Home Runs of her own, tabulating 4 RBI in total. Rachele Fico and Kelly Barnhill each threw 4 Strikeouts.

The USSSA Pride and the Cleveland Comets started a 4-game series at Sprenger Stadium on Tuesday, July 9. The opener was a 3-1 victory for the Comets, snapping 16-game Pride winning streaks before in the 2019 season and against the Cleveland Comets franchise, who had never previously beaten the Pride. Lilli Piper went 3-3 with a Double and an RBI while Sierra Hyland closed the game with 2 Innings of perfect relief, nabbing 3 Strikeouts along the way. Shay Knighten hit a Home Run for the Pride. The Pride evened the series the next day with a 5-1 response. Jessie Warren hit a Home Run for the Pride while Megan Good went 2-3 with an RBI Double while also pitching 0.2 innings. Amanda Sanchez scored the only Run for the Comets when she hit a Solo Home Run in the team's first At-Bat. The next day, the Comets took a 5-0 Shutout victory behind the combined pitching effort of Taylor McQuillin and Sierra Hyland. Hyland's 2.2 Innings Pitched of relief also happened to be Hitless

while Amanda Sanchez hit a Home Run for the second consecutive game. The Comets closed the series with a 2-1 victory on Friday, July 12. The Comets took the lead for good when Sashel Palacios hit an RBI Single in the bottom of the fifth inning. Lilli Piper reached base in every At-Bat, Singling, Walking, and being Hit by a Pitch.

The Aussie Peppers and Cleveland Comets started a 6-game series on Saturday, July 13. The first 2 games, held at Sprenger Stadium, were played this weekend; the final 4 games will be played next week at Firestone Stadium in Akron, Ohio. The series began with a 4-0 victory for the Comets. Cheyanne Tarango threw a Complete Game Shutout, Amanda Sanchez hit 2-2 with a Walk and a Sacrifice Fly, and Victoria Vidales and Sashel Palacios hit Home Runs. The Peppers tied the series on Sunday, July 14, with a 3-1 win. Kaia Parnaby pitched a Complete Game and threw 10 Strikeouts while Jade Wall hit a 2-RBI Single that proved the difference. Sammy Marshall hit 2-3 and Stole 3 Bases for the Comets.

Player of the Week: Amanda Chidester, Chicago Bandits

Amanda Chidester recorded at least 1 hit in all 5 games she played this week and demonstrated her talent for hitting home runs. Chidester had 2-hit games on Tuesday, July 9; in the second half of a Wednesday, July 10 doubleheader; and on Thursday, July 11, all in games against the Aussie Peppers. In the last of these games, both of her hits were home runs, and she drove in 4 RBI. Chidester also hit home runs on Monday, July 8 and in the first half of the Wednesday doubleheader.

Kaia Parnaby put together a series of tremendous pitching performances in the circle this week for the Aussie Peppers. On Tuesday, July 9, she pitched a Complete Game in the Peppers's 5-1 victory over the league-leading Chicago Bandits, throwing 9 strikeouts against only 1 walk, and the only run she allowed was unearned. On Thursday, July 11, she threw the first 3.1 innings of an eventual 7-1 loss to the Bandits but was not charged with a decision, only giving up 1 of the runs. In her final games of the week on Sunday, July 14, Parnaby threw 10 strikeouts and only 2 walks in a 3-1 Complete Game victory over the Cleveland Comets.

Major Trade

On Thursday, July 11, the USSSA Pride and the Cleveland Comets made a trade which included some of the most notable players in the NPF. The Pride sent Paige Parker and Nicole Pendley to the Comets and received Brittany Cervantes, Emily Carosone, and the rights to Meghan King in return. Parker and Pendley were both 2018 USSSA Pride draft selections from the University of Oklahoma, chosen 6th and 12th, respectively. In exchange, the Pride acquired players with previous highly successful NPF experience who have struggled at the plate so far this season; Emily Carosone tied for the league lead in Home Runs last season with 12 while Cervantes is tied for 4th on the all-time Home Run list. The deal was performed in the middle of a series between the two teams played at the Comets's home stadium, Sprenger Stadium.

2019 NPF Venues

Caswell Park in Mankato, Minnesota

- Caswell Park is a 25-acre facility built in 1985.
- The facility also hosts Mankato United in the Women's Premier Soccer League, the world's largest women's soccer league with 119 teams.
- Caswell Park is home to the Mankato Peppers, a youth softball organization founded in 1982 which has sent 76 players to play college softball and trained two NPF players, Coley Ries of the Aussie Peppers and Ann Steffan, who has retired.
- Before being home to the Aussie Peppers, Caswell Park hosted a 2018 regular season series between the Chicago Bandits and the Beijing Shougang Eagles.

Jackie Robinson Ballpark - Daytona Beach, Florida

- Opened on June 4, 1914.
- Is the 4th-oldest ballpark still in use in professional baseball.
- The ball park was renamed after Jackie Robinson in 1989, and a statue was erected in his honor outside the Orange Avenue Gate.
- Home of the Cincinnati Reds's Class A-Advanced baseball affiliate, the Daytona Tortugas.

Parkway Bank Sports Complex in Rosemont, Illinois

- The Dome at the Parkway Bank Sports Complex is an indoor sports venue, composed of two baseball/softball diamonds and supporting facilities, all of which are available for children's and adults' leagues and individual team play.
- It has been built to NCAA standards for use in college tournaments and championships.
- According to its website, "the stadium is the first facility of its kind in the nation built expressly for women's professional sports."
- The stadium has a 2,000-seat capacity.
- Rosemont is approximately 20 miles northwest of Chicago

Rent One Park in Marion, Illinois

- The stadium also hosts the Southern Illinois Miners of the Independent Frontier League and the annual Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Tournament.
- Capacity includes 3,400 chair seats and lawn seating which can hold over 2,000 spectators.
- There is also a 10-hole mini golf course on site

Sprenger Stadium in Avon, OH

- Sprenger Stadium is the home of the Lake Erie Crushers, an independent baseball team in the Frontier League. The stadium was also host to the Cleveland State baseball team for two years before the university dropped the sport after the 2011 season.
- There is a kids zone with inflatables behind the right field fence requiring paid entry.
- The stadium has an estimated capacity of 5,000.
- Avon, Ohio, is located approximately 20 miles west of Cleveland.

Space Coast Stadium in Viera, FL

- Part of the USSSA Space Coast Complex, an 85-acre facility featuring 15 all-turf fields.
- Previously served as the spring training facility for the Florida Marlins and the Montreal Expos-Washington Nationals and as the stadium for the Class A-Advanced Brevard County Manatees from 1994 until 2016.
- The stadium underwent a full renovation which was completed in time for the 2018 season.
- Both the Pride and the Complex are owned and operated by the United States Specialty Sports Association, a multi-sport organization which sponsors thirteen sports

Firestone Stadium in Akron, Ohio

- Former home of the NPF's Akron Racers and hosted 6 Cleveland Comets games last season.
- Firestone Stadium is the current annual host of the Mid-American Conference Softball Tournament.
- Firestone Stadium was dedicated in 1925 and donated to the City of Akron in 1988.

T-Bones Stadium in Kansas City, Kansas

- T-Bones Stadium has been the home of the Kansas City T-Bones, a baseball team in the independent American Association, since 2003. The stadium also occasionally hosts high school games prior to the start of the T-Bones's season.
- This will be fifth consecutive season in which T-Bones Stadium hosts an NPF series. Last season, they hosted two games between the USSSA Pride and Aussie Spirit (now Peppers).
- The stadium has a fixed capacity of 4,800 with various other open spaces which can provide additional seating.

Bobby's Corner - Quick Facts

- When the Cleveland Comets defeated the USSSA Pride 3-1 on July 9, they broke two different 16-game winning streaks for the Pride. Before this game, the Pride had won 16 games in a row overall and 16 games in a row against the Comets. The Comets had never previously beaten the Pride since they originated in 2018
- The USSSA Pride have not lost consecutive regular season series since 2009, their inaugural season, when they lost 4 of 5 games against the Akron Racers between July 29-August 2 and 3 of 5 games against the Rockford Thunder between August 5-9. The Pride lost their most recent series, against the Cleveland Comets, and play a 2-game series against the standings-leading Chicago Bandits at the neutral site of T-Bones Stadium in Kansas City, Kansas, starting on Monday, July 15.
- The USSSA Pride have not lost 3 consecutive games since July 10-12, 2017, when they were swept in a series by the Texas Charge. The Pride lost their last 2 games of the previous week and play the Chicago Bandits on Monday, July 15.
- On Thursday, July 11, Abbey Cheek of the Chicago Bandits hit 3 Home Runs against the Aussie Peppers. Notable players who hit 3 Home Runs in a game include: Crystl Bustos, Jessica Mendoza, and Chelsea Goodacre. Cheek had the additional distinction of hitting her Home Runs in consecutive innings: the 4th, 5th, and 6th.
- With her next Home Run, which would be the 46th of her career, Brittany Cervantes of the USSSA Pride will break a tie with Oli Keohohou and move into sole possession of fourth on the all-time list.
- Wang Lan's 5-Inning Perfect Game against the Aussie Peppers on June 24 was her first at any level and the first of the 2019 NPF season.
- On June 9 against the Cleveland Comets, Kristyn Sandberg of the Chicago Bandits drove in her 157th career RBI, passing Nicole Trimboli and Alisa Goler for fourth on the all-time list.
- On June 20 against the Canadian Wild of the Chicago Bandits hit her 36th career Double, passing GiOnna DiSalvatore for fifth on the all-time list.
- On June 27 against the Cleveland Comets, Megan Wiggins of the USSSA Pride hit her 389th career Hit, passing Natasha Watley for second on the all-time list.
- On June 29 against the Aussie Peppers, Sammy Marshall of the Cleveland Comets Stole her 62nd career Base to move into fourth on the all-time list, passing Lisa Modglin and Sharonda McDonald.
- On July 1 against the Beijing Eagles, Jolene Henderson of the USSSA Pride threw a Perfect Game, the second of the season and the first in a 7-inning game this season. In that game, she also secured her 9th career Shutout, passing Danielle Lawrie for fifth on the all-time list.
- Megan Wiggins and Kelly Kretschman, both of the USSSA Pride, are 1st and 2nd in Career Home Runs with 84 and 55, respectively. The 29 Home Run gap between them is greater than Kretschman's three most prolific Home Run-hitting seasons combined.
- Kelly Kretschman and Megan Wiggins of the USSSA Pride are 1st and 2nd on the all-time list in RBI, Hits, Runs, and Doubles. Kretschman is 8 RBI, 105 Hits, 4 Runs, and 1 Double ahead through Sunday's games.
- In a June 22 doubleheader against the Canadian Wild, Hannah Flippen of the Chicago Bandits recorded 3 Triples. The all-time record for a season is 4, set by Megan Wiggins of the USSSA Pride in the 2017 and 2018 seasons.
- In her record-setting 2017 and 2018 seasons, Megan Wiggins hit 4 Triples each. The 8 Triples she hit in those two seasons by themselves would put her fifth on the all-time list. Furthermore, removing those 8 Triples from her all-time total of 18 would still leave Wiggins first on the all-time list.
- No #1 Overall Pick has ever won NPF Rookie of the Year. This year's #1 Overall Pick was Kelly Barnhill of the Chicago Bandits.

Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 Qualification

Six nations will participate in the softball competition at the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020.

#2-ranked Japan earned an automatic entry for the event as the tournament host.

The #1 United States procured a bid by winning the 2018 WBSC Women's Softball World Championship, held in Chiba, Japan.

One bid will be earned from the Europe/Africa Softball Olympic Qualifier hosted in Utrecht, Netherlands from July 23-27. Eight teams will participate in this qualifier, including: world #28 South Africa, #43 Botswana, and six European nations to be determined. These European qualifiers will be decided at the 2019 European Women's Championship held in Ostrava, Czech Republic from June 30-July 6.

Twelve nations will vie for two spots in the Americas Softball Olympic Qualifier hosted in Surrey, British Columbia, Canada from August 25-September 1. Group A of this competition includes: #3 Canada, #4 Puerto Rico, #17 Cuba, #18 Guatemala, #25 Argentina, and the #39 Bahamas; Group B includes: #5 Mexico, #14 Brazil, #16 Venezuela, the #19 Dominican Republic, #20 Peru, and the #57 British Virgin Islands.

The final qualifier will assign one spot to one of eight teams competing in the Asia/Oceania Softball Olympic Qualifier held in Shanghai, China, from September 24-29. These eight nations are: #6 Chinese Taipei, #7 Australia, #8 China, #11 New Zealand, the #13 Philippines, the #23 Republic of Korea, #37 Indonesia, and #42 Hong Kong.

season and offers an attractive live content product and family friendly activity. Other turn key activation events have been nurtured under Kempf, including the annual College Draft, balanced regular season competition and NPFTV- the League's own digital platform for live game action.

In 2018, the league celebrated its 15th anniversary in its current form of National Pro Fastpitch. The league currently is the professional home for 3 national federation teams (Australia, Canada and China) from 3 different continents. The league also includes players who are members of 4 additional national federation teams, including the U.S. Women's National Team.

Prior to joining the NPF, Kempf spent 15 years as owner and lead instructor at Club K, the women's fastpitch training facility she founded in 1990. During that time, Club K, grew to be the world's largest training facility for women's fastpitch softball, encompassing 35,000 square feet of training space with students in weekly lessons hailing from 7 different states. Kempf authored an instructional book on pitching, "The Softball Pitching Edge", which has also been produced in video and ebook. She also authored a software series in pitching mechanics for Dartfish.

Since 2000, Kempf has been a popular television analyst for college and professional softball, working with ESPN, Fox Sports, MLB Network, Cox Sports, YES Network and Comcast Sports. She has also become a staple in ESPN's coverage of the NCAA Tournament and for 10 seasons was the studio analyst for the Women's College World Series.

As a player, Kempf was a pitcher on the 1992 USA National Team that earned a gold medal in the World Cup in Beijing, China. She was also a two-time Women's Majors National Champion as a member of the renowned Raybesto's Brakettes of Stratford, Conn. During her collegiate career, Kempf was a standout pitcher for Missouri Western State University, earning the National MVP award en route to helping her team capture the only national championship in school history.

Thanks to her stellar softball career, Kempf has been inducted into four Halls of Fame – the NAIA National Hall of Fame, the Missouri Western State University Hall of Fame, the St. Joseph Baseball Hall of Fame and the Amateur Softball of America State of Missouri Hall of Fame.

National Federations' Involvement in the NPF

On April 11, 2017, National Pro Fastpitch announced the addition of Beijing Shougang to the NPF's membership. The Beijing Shougang, since renamed the Beijing Eagles, is managed by the Chinese Softball Association, and their roster primarily consists of players eligible for the Chinese national team. This was the first time a national team federation had placed a team in the league. Qin Xiaowen, CEO of Beijing Shougang Sports, announced at the team's launch that "We hope that participating in NPF competition will accelerate the skills advancement of our players in the near term" with the longer-term goal of "the future development of professional baseball and softball and [to] promote the development of other related projects in China." This year, the Beijing Eagles will have a stable home stadium for the first time, playing at Jackie Robinson Ballpark in Daytona Beach, Florida, as part of an agreement which would include the Chinese national team training in Daytona Beach in 2020 if they qualify for the Tokyo Olympics. The Chinese national team won the silver medal in Atlanta in 1996.

On December 28, 2017, National Pro Fastpitch announced the addition of the Aussie Spirit to the league's ranks. The Aussie Spirit, since renamed the Aussie Peppers, is operated by Softball Australia, the nation's governing body for softball. Chet Gray, the Softball Australia CEO, stated that one of the explicit goals of joining the league was to "give the Australian team a boost ahead of the 2018 WBSC World Championship which is also a potential qualifying event for Tokyo 2020." Ultimately, Australia recorded a 6-4 record in that competition, finishing fourth. NPF Commissioner Cheri Kempf celebrated the move as one that "increases the reach of the professional softball footprint, not just domestically, but globally." The Australian national team has medaled in all four previous Olympic softball tournaments, earning silver at Athens 2004 and bronze at Atlanta 1996, Sydney 2000, and Beijing 2008.

On October 30, 2018, National Pro Fastpitch announced the addition of the Canadian Wild of Southern Illinois as an affiliate NPF team. NPF Commissioner Cheri Kempf said during the launch, "To add an international team of the quality of Canada, currently ranked third in the world, and to add the operational excellence of the administration at Rent One Park, [where the Wild will play,] is a home run for all of us." Softball Canada CEO Hugh Mitchener stated that the organization is "delighted to be announcing our entry into the NPF in 2019."

On March 27, 2019, the Cleveland Comets announced a cooperative partnership with Team Mexico for the upcoming NPF season, where various players eligible for Team Mexico will be placed on Cleveland's roster as an opportunity to earn a spot on the national team. Ing. Rolando Cruz Guerrero, President of Team Mexico, stated that "The Mexican National Softball Federation and its sports government entities, the Mexican Olympic Committee (COM) and CONADE, are thrilled on the tremendous value that this Comets/Team Mexico partnership will bring us. [...] We know that National Pro Fastpitch will feature top notch competition, and we want to provide our athletes with the best opportunities to succeed in their quest of preparing and competing for a qualifying spot in the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo."
